

UPPER ENDOSCOPY (EGD) INSTRUCTIONS



Date & Location

You should have received the date and location of your endoscopy from our practice by phone, through the portal, and/or email and text messaging. If you do not know your procedure date or location, please contact our practice. <u>Your procedure time will be</u> communicated to you by the facility the day before your procedure.



Medications

If you take any of the following medications, please inform our scheduling staff as soon as possible so we can coordinate stopping these medications with your prescribing physician:

- □ **Blood thinners** including but not limited to Coumadin (warfarin), Plavix (clopidogrel), Xarelto (rivaroxaban), Eliquis (apixaban).
- ☐ **GLP1 medications** such as Trulicity (dulaglutide), Ozempic (semaglutide), Victoza (liraglutide), Bydureon (exenatide) used for diabetes or weight loss.



Transportation

Driving is not permitted until the day after your procedure. Arrange for a ride to and from the center from someone 18 or older who can take responsibility for your care. That person should arrive no later than 1 hour after your procedure time.



Cancellation/No-Show

Our practice charges \$100 for an upper endoscopy (EGD) and \$200 for a combined colonoscopy/EGD that is cancelled within 7 business days of a procedure. For patients who have canceled in the past, a \$100 refundable deposit will be taken to secure your appointment. The deposit will be refunded after your procedure is completed if your account is in good standing.

 Contact your insurance company with benefit questions. If you take insulin, ask your prescribing physician (primary care or endocrinologist) for instructions on how much insulin to take 1 day before and on the day of the procedure. If your location is Bedfor Ambulatory Surgery Center or Surgical Center of NH, complete your health history in One Medical Passport (sent by facility). To cancel without incurring a fee, you must call our office at least 7 days before the procedure. 	 □ Do not eat anything solid after midnight. You may have clear liquids ONLY after midnight. □ Examples of clear liquids can be found on our website as indicated on page 1. Avoid anything red or purple. 	 Do not drink any liquids, chew gum or tobacco, or suck on hard candies for at least 3 hours prior to your arrival time. Do not smoke anything the morning of your procedure. Please take your medications as prescribed EXCEPT for those listed below. Medicines must be taken at least 3 hours prior to your arrival time. Take insulin according to PCP or endocrinologist instructions. Do not take diuretics (water/fluid pills), oral diabetic medications, iron pills, vitamins, or Carafate (sucralfate). If you have questions about what to take, please call us at least 1 business day before your arrival time. Bring a list of your current medications to your procedure.
